

"THERE IS A TIME FOR EVERYTHING
AND A SEASON FOR EVERY ACTIVITY UNDER HEAVEN" – Ecclesiastes 3:1.

HISTORY – According to the book, "THE ROMANCE OF THE BLUE TRIANGLES", the first mention of a Young Women's Christian Association in Pietermaritzburg was in 1896 by Sir Henry Bale, and the first Committee Meeting took place on the 30th March of that year.

The first YWCA House in Pietermaritzburg was on the corner of Chapel (now called Peter Kerchoff) and Pietermaritz Streets. In 1972 The YWCA moved into another House in Pietermaritz Street, and the original House was sold. The second building was sold in 1995 and the current property, at 31 Golf Road in Scottsville, across the road from the UKZN campus, was purchased. The purpose-built student accommodation was opened in 2000 – very few of our current residents were born at that time, which is a sobering thought!

SOON TO BE HISTORY - **THE PARENTS:** Penny and I came to The YW Pietermaritzburg at the beginning of 2011 and will retire at the end of 2023. We had taken the position without seeing the property as we had been interviewed in Cape Town, so it was quite a tense drive. We arrived in the evening and so it was really only the next day that we got to explore.



The best part was meeting the young ladies who were residing here at the time. Our eldest daughter had passed away in September of 2010, so the grief was still very raw. What a joy it was, and still is, to bond with all our additional "daughters". At the end of each year, we say goodbye to some of them as they complete their studies and move off to take on the world, and at the beginning of the next year we welcome the new ones, many of whom have just completed their Matric and are venturing from home for the first time.

It has been a privilege to get to know all of the young ladies, some already bruised and battered by the harshness of life, and see them mature. It is always good to hear from girls who have become part of The Y family, although we have, unfortunately, lost touch with some of them.

It will be a very emotional parting for us as we drive out of The YW Pietermaritzburg for the last time, but the Lord has been with us thus far and we look forward to what he has in store for us during our next season.

With the assistance of The YW Trust, we have been able to carry out a lot of renovation and upgrading.




